



(GS 1961, HS 1965, BSBA 1969, MBA 1971)

Over the decades, Mr. Blanco has proven himself to be an invaluable part of the DLSAA through the many roles he has fulfilled. He has been a DLSAA Board Director since 1993, and continues to serve the Lasallian community under this position to this day.

ABOUT THE OLSNOE

Throughout the decades, La Salle has recognized exceptional people and organizations who have made a lasting impact within the Lasallian community, our country and overseas.

The way in which these deserving parties are awarded has evolved over the years to adapt to the changing times. The late Br. J. Benedict, DLSU's long-time DLSAA Vice President for Development and Alumni Affairs, was solely in charge of nominating outstanding alumni in various fields from 1950 to 2003.

It should also be noted that in 1996, this award was designated as the "Distinguished Lasallian Award" which did not have a specific professional or industry classification.

Furthermore, the 1964 High School De La Salle Alumni Sports Foundation started the Sports Hall of Fame Award in 1992, which was then subsequently turned over to the De La Salle Alumni Association (DLSAA) in 2005.

When Br. J. Benedict passed away in 2003, the DLSAA, which was headed by President Eduardo R. Lucero at the time, sought to enhance and restructure the awards in order to better recognize the distinguished members of the Lasallian community.

By 2005, they came out with the DLSAA Honors and Awards System as it is known today. This development created a formal and systematized awarding process that features an expanded range of awards and categories.

With its current format, the OLSNOE has now consolidated all the awards that were previously given during specific dinners, homecoming functions and sports events. Better still, it emulates the spirit of prestigious ceremonies such as the Oscars that include entertainment, making this night an elegant affair.

The OLSNOE also serves as a timeless testament and inspiration for the current generation of Lasallians who can learn from the awardees. This will resonate with them, including their academic lives and future careers.

Ultimately, the OLSNOE is instrumental in motivating younger Lasallians to become dynamic agents of social change in whatever path they choose in life.


The DLSAA Distinguished Lasallian

NATIONAL ARTIST CIRILO F. BAUTISTA

(DOCTOR OF ARTS IN LANGUAGE AND LITERATURE 1991)



With a prolific body of work to his name, National Artist Cirilo F. Bautista has made a timeless and farreaching impact not only in the literary world, but also on our collective consciousness as a nation.


Being a Multi-Palanca awardee (among his many achievements), Bautista has gained international recognition for his unparalleled ability to articulate the complexity of the human condition with his work in fiction and poetry. He is famous for timeless works such as The Cave and Other Poems (1968), Charts (poetry, 1973), Sugat ng Salita (poetry, 1986), and Stories (1990).

He has also inspired countless other writers and poets, having delivered lectures on literature across the nation as well as teaching at DLSU as a Professor Emeritus of Literature and University Fellow. To this day, Bautista continues to be a pillar in the literary community and was recently declared by President Benigno Aquino III as the National Artist for Literature in 2014.

BR. GUS L. BOQUER FSC

(BS EDUCATION 1966, ST. MARY'S COLLEGE OF CALIFORNIA USA, MA EDUCATIONAL ADMINISTRATION AND LEADERSHIP 1981, USLS DOCTOR OF EDUCATION 1998)



Br. Boquer has made an enormous contribution to two Lasallian institutions, namely DLS-Health Sciences Institute and De La Salle University-Dasmariñas. Thanks to his tireless efforts as President and Chancellor, both schools have benefited immensely.

In particular, Br. Boquer's involvement has helped shape DLSHSI to become the country's first information-based premiere medical and health school. DLSU-D has also become the widely respected academic center that it is today as a result of his endeavors.

In addition to his academic pursuits, he successfully established Bahay Pag-asa, a transformation center for children in conflict with the law.

Throughout his years of service, Br. Boquer has continuously embodied the Lasallian values of faith, zeal, service and social responsibility, making him an invaluable member of our community.

SENATOR RAMON B. MAGSAYSAY JR.

(GS 1952, HS 1956, BSME 1961)



With an equal passion for public service and entrepreneurship, Senator Magsaysay's unique combination of knowledge and experience has enabled him to serve his fellow countrymen in many ways.

His time in Senate is a testament to his integrity - Magsaysay's record is free of political scandals and corruption. He co-authored numerous laws such as the Anti-Money Laundering Act of 2001 (RA 9160) in line with his stand against the concealment of ill-gotten wealth. In addition to this, he spearheaded an investigation into the fertilizer fund scam several years ago.

Magsaysay also enacted legislation to improve the Filipino people's economic well-being, specifically with cooperatives and small and medium enterprises (SMEs) in the agricultural sector. As such, he was the principal sponsor of the Agricultural and Fisheries Modernization Act and acted as the main proponent of the Young Farmers Program.

It is the sum of these efforts that have made Magsaysay a driving force for championing human rights, just leadership and creating a morally conscious society.

JUSTICE TEODORO R. PADILLA†

(HS 1944, DOCTOR OF LAWS (LL.D) HONORIS CAUSA 1998)



Justice Teodoro R. Padilla has left a legacy of exemplary service which has enriched the country's jurisprudence. Being an Associate Justice of the Supreme Court from 1987 – 1997, he enacted a number of key decisions and was known for having strong opinions on matters that affect society.

Some of his many accomplishments include receiving the 1991 Most Outstanding UP Law Alumni Award and the Papal Knighthood in the Order of St. Gregory the Great, and serving as Chairman of the First Division of the Supreme Court and the Electoral Tribunal.


To this day, the Lasallian values he exemplified during his career still resonate with his family, friends, colleagues and many others.

Sy was the first Exec. Vice President of the privately held SM Investments Corporation, a major conglomerate involved in retail, banking and property development.

He also serves as President and CEO of the publicly-listed SM Prime Holdings, Inc., one of the largest and most valuable property companies in Southeast Asia that develops malls, hotels and residential areas. Sy oversees the shopping mall operations, as well as the engineering and construction divisions within the SM Group.

Furthermore, SM Prime has launched many initiatives related to civic assistance and environmental sustainability projects. This includes continuous efforts to refine business operations through its Green Retail Agenda as well as their partnership with the United Nations Office for Disaster Risk Reduction (UNISDR).



This award also recognizes the efforts of those who have enhanced sports for La Salle and the Philippines. They should also exemplify qualities and characteristics, serve as a role model and inspire Lasallians and the Filipino youth to excel in sports.


Inductees are awarded on a onetime basis. Those nominated should be out of any La Salle District school for a minimum of twenty (20) years since graduating or their last playing date (whichever comes first).

BASKETBALL ALFRED P. ALMARIO †

(BSC MARKETING 1987)



Affectionately referred to as "Alfie" by his family and friends, Almario was known for his easygoing personality. On the basketball court however, he was a force to be reckoned with.

In 1981, Almario played an instrumental role in two interclub titles for the De La Salle Green Archers. Then, in 1982 he earned the designation of "Top Gun" in the 7th Asian Youth Basketball Championship and was selected to the Mythical Five.

He went on to play in the PBA for San Miguel Beer from 1986-1990, further solidifying his status as an athletic professional of the highest caliber. Though he passed on in 2001, the level of sportsmanship he brought to Philippine basketball will always be remembered by both fans and Lasallians alike.

SWIMMING ERIC R. BUHAIN

(DLSZ GS 1983, DLSZ HS 1987, LA SALLE UNI-VERSITY PHILADELPHIA, PENNSYLVANIA, USA BS FINANCE 1991)



Buhain made his mark in international swimming by winning the Gold Medal (400m Individual Medley) at the 1985 SEA Games held at Bangkok, Thailand, making it an unprecedented accomplishment that brought pride to the country.

In 1989, he made history again at the SEA Games in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia. This time, Buhain won the Gold Medal in the 200m and 400m Individual Medley, as well as the 200m Butterfly category. He also clinched the Silver Medal for the 100m Butterfly category.

This accomplishment earned him the SEA Games Coca-Cola Gold Award of "Best Male Athlete of the SEA Games", further propelling him to greater fame.


After that, Buhain won Gold Medal for 100m Butterfly, Silver Medal for the 100m Breast Stroke category and Bronze Medal for the 200m Individual Medley during the 1993 Southeast Asian Games in Singapore.

In the subsequent years, Buhain continued to be an inspiration to countless athletes and the community in general. He has constantly endeavored to raise the country's standard of performance and governance in Philippine sports in his later roles as chairman of the Philippine Sports Commission as well as the Games and Amusement Board.

FOOTBALL ENRIQUE MA. R. LLAMAS †

(GS 1955, HS 1960, BSBA 1964)



Enrique Llamas is one of the long-remembered names in the Lasallian community for his numerous contributions to La Salle's legacy in football as both goalie and striker.

In 1962, he participated in the Asian Games in Jakarta, Indonesia, bringing honor to La Salle and our country. Llamas then became the football coach for DLSU in 1979. Additionally, he was also a member of the National Student Football Champion Team and the Track & Field division of the Gymnastics Team.

Thanks to the invaluable guidance and support he gave during his career, Llamas played a vital role in making La Salle the strong presence in football that it is today.



FOOTBALL DANIEL M. MORAN

(LSGH GS 1969, LSGH HS 1973, AB MATHEMATICS 1977)



Moran is known for his unparalleled passion for football, having played a key role in countless tournaments and sporting events that established his career in sports.

During his high school years, he represented the country as part of the Philippine National Youth Team in Bangkok and Kuwait. It was also during this time that he participated in the Philippine National Team Friendly Games in China and Philippine National Team Olympic Eliminations in Japan.

Moran was also one of the NCAA junior champions from 1971 to 1973. He played for Kasibulan (National Youth Selection Team) from 1973 to 1976 and graduated from LSGH in 1973 as Athlete of the Year, underscoring Moran's status as a top player during his early years.

Moran was just as active during college, being part of the DLSU NCAA senior champions in 1974, 1976 and 1977 and the UAAP UP champions in 1975. Like before, he graduated from DLSU in 1977 with flying colors as Football player of the year.

Then, he was awarded in 1978 for being the highest goal scorer for the Philippine National League tournament. Moran moved on to play for the U/Tex Club team from 1977 to 1978 and the San Miguel team from 1978 to 1980.

It is for these and many other accomplishments that Moran is recognized for elevating football to great heights in the Philippines.

FOOTBALL MICHAEL M. MORAN

(LSGH GS 1968, LSGH HS 1972, AB PHILOSOPHY AND LETTERS 1976)



Michael Moran's drive for excellence in football has helped him achieve acclaim on both an international and national level. He was part of the RP Team that played in the Asian Youth Tournament held in Bangkok and Kuwait in 1972, 1974 and 1975.

Moran played a key role in the DLSU Senior Football Team as Captain, leading them to become the NCAA Champion for a total of 4 years. Moran played for the RP Team again in 1976, this time at the China Football Tournaments.

Moran was also a member of club teams such as San Miguel, CDCDP and HSBC (HKG) from 1976 to 1982. Thanks to Moran's active participation, he helped establish La Salle and the country's reputation as skilled and talented football players worthy of the international arena.

CONTRIBUTION TO DLSU SPORTS BR. BERNARD S. OCA FSC

Br. Bernard Oca is instrumental in pushing La Salle to greater excellence because of his unmatched devotion to realizing the school's athletic potential. From 2009-2011, he was the Executive Director for the DLSU Office of Sports Development.

Br. Oca was also the president of the University Athletic Association of the Philippines (UAAP) where he sought to raise the standard of professionalism and sportsmanship in the country. In 2001, he became a member of the Election Board of the Philippine Olympic Committee.


As a result of his vision, leadership and management during his time in the Office of Sports Development, DLSU was able to earn its first ever General Championship crown in the UAAP. His support for DLSU's sports programs also extends to a deeper level - he is often present at the UAAP games, enthusiastically cheering on our teams from the sidelines.

Being a sports-minded person himself, he is very much at home with the sports community, personally speaking to the various teams and their respective coaches at every chance he gets. Br. Oca's presence has resonated with our players and motivated them greatly. It has pushed them to give everything they have to win and seize every possible opportunity for greatness.

(LSGH GS 1972, LSGH HS 1977)




Coach Hans Smit's wisdom and expertise in football is only surpassed by his ferocity on the field, rightfully earning him a place in the Sports Hall of Fame. With a coaching career spanning three decades, Smit's colleagues, former players and fans can personally attest to his unbridled passion for the game.

Countless teams have been under his care, such as those from DLSU, DLSZ and even the RP football team, all of which have benefitted immensely from Smit's unique style of coaching. His method of training has made every team he's helped an intimidating presence, making them both feared and respected by the opposing team.

Smit has coached in international meets across the globe, including Hong Kong, Singapore, Thailand, Finland, Sweden, Denmark, Malaysia, U.S.A., U.K., Italy, and Spain. He's also acted in numerous other roles, such as Football Project Director, Commissioner, Sports Consultant, Secretary-General, Tournament Director, Trainer and Athletic Director.

Aside from the Sports Hall of Fame Award, he was previously recognized with the DLSAA Lasallian Sports Achievement award in 2008. Over the years, his players have attributed their success in sports to Smit's rigorous standards for athletic excellence. Not only has Smit helped them achieve their maximum potential, they've also learned valuable life lessons from him that they carry to this day.



ACHIEVEMENT AWARD

DEAF EDUCATION ANA KRISTINA M. ARCE

(DLS-CSB B.A. APPLIED DEAF STUDIES 2009)



Arce is the youngest recipient of the Lasallian Achievement award and has made strides in her career to become an internationally recognized expert in her field. She was the first Filipino to be awarded the World Deaf Leadership Scholarship at the Gallaudet University in Washington D.C. in 2012.

This institute is the world leader in liberal education and career development for students who are Deaf and hearing impaired. It was here that Arce built her educational foundations and graduated with a master's degree in Deaf Studies with a concentration in Cultural Studies.

She quickly went on to apply her knowledge and expertise in the professional world. Driven by her desire to help those in need, Arce is presently teaching Deaf undergraduate students.

Using her specialized bilingual method, Arce seeks to empower hearing impaired individuals who face the challenge of acquiring basic literacy skills early on in their lives. She strives to help them develop their reading and writing abilities in order to prepare them for college and beyond.

Moreover, Arce aims to educate parents of Deaf children and special education teachers in the use of Filipino Sign Language (FSL) as part of her holistic approach to Deaf awareness. The impact Arce has made in the lives of her students is immeasurable and will benefit them for decades to come.

DR. RAUL V. DESTURA (DLSHSI MEDICINE 1996)



Specializing in infectious diseases and molecular biology, Dr. Destura has been recognized many times over in the medical community for his groundbreaking work.

He received a research scholarship grant for the International Training and Fellowship on Emerging Infectious Diseases at the Center for Global Health, University of Virginia School of Medicine. Dr. Destura worked there as a research fellow and collaborator in the Mid-Atlantic Regional Center for Excellence in Biodefense Research primarily on low-dose enteric pathogens.

He was also the TOYM 2011 Awardee for Medical Research and honored for developing the Dengue LAMP Test Kit. Thanks to his breakthrough, it is now possible to detect dengue as early as the first day of fever. As a result, this innovation allows for an early diagnosis, saving countless lives in the process.

His other grants include the Bill and Melinda Gates Travel Scholarship Grant for Molecular Helminthology as well as the Infectious Disease Society of America Travel Grant for Excellence in Research.


At present, Dr. Destura continues to be a leading authority as director for the Institute of Molecular Biotechnology for the National Institute of Health in U.P. Manila. He has won several prestigious awards and accolades, earning him the admiration and respect of his esteemed peers.



PEACE ADVOCACY
FRANZ G. ONTAL

(USLS HS 1980, USLS BS BIOLOGY 1985)



Global peace is an on-going effort, and Ontal's continued achievements in this area have helped make the world a safer place. His notable work includes his role as head of inspector training at the Organization for the Prohibition of Chemical Weapons (OPCW).

Ontal previously worked as a paramedic and emergency medical technician instructor for the New York City Health and Hospital Corporation, then moved to The Hague, Netherlands to join the OPCW. He started out as a medic for the chemical weapons inspector and disposal teams before being promoted to his current position.

His involvement with the OPCW has earned him the Nobel Peace Prize for "extensive efforts at eliminating the chemical weapons that have haunted the world from Hitler's gas chambers to the Syrian battlefields."

Ontal understands the horrific consequences of armed conflict and it fuels his passion for peace. This has also led him to contribute to OPCW's role as the implementing body of the Chemical Weapons Convention, which is the first international treaty to prohibit an entire class of chemical weapons.

ECONOMICS EDUCATION TERESO S. TULLAO JR., PhD (AB ECONOMICS 1972), SUMMA CUM LAUDE



As a renowned authority in the field of economics, Tullao has written definitive books on the subject matter over the decades.

While he is a University Fellow and professor of economics at DLSU, his roots with the school go back to the early 1970s as a teacher and department chair. Tullao also served as the dean of the College of Business and Economics of DLSU from 1996-2001.

He took up his Ph.D. in international economics and MA in Law and Diplomacy at the Fletcher School of Law and Diplomacy at Tufts University, Massachusetts (U.S.A.). Furthermore, Tullao completed his MA degree in Development Education at Stanford University in California.

In 1993, the Metrobank Foundation recognized him as one of the most outstanding teachers in the Philippines. Tullao excels as a researcher and writer, having come out with several written works including publications, textbooks and articles published nationwide and online.

Yang went on to become anchor for Bloomberg Television Asia-Pacific for nearly a decade. She was also a Reporter-Presenter at the Hong Kong-based Reuters TV where she conducted live financial market reports and produced human-interest feature packages.

She was a three-time winner of the Best News Presenter award at the prestigious Asian Television Awards from 2001 to 2003, making it an unprecedented achievement for that specific category.

On top of that, the Filipino-Chinese Federation of Business and Professional Women in the Philippines recognized Yang as the most notable woman achiever in the field of media in 2008.

At present, she is the correspondent for CCTV's English Channel in Hong Kong. Yang's multiple accolades in the international news community have become a shining example not only for aspiring female journalists in the Philippines, but across the Asian-Pacific region as well.
