

# About The OLSNOE

s an organization of alumni of De La Salle Philippines, Inc. (DLSPI) and affiliate institutions, the DLSAA confers awards that are different and distinct from other school of the De La Salle Brothers - Philippine District (DLSB - PD).

In 2005, the DLSAA Honors and Awards System was established to create a formal and systematized awarding process. With it comes a structured system for categories, awardee qualifications and criteria, procedures, and implementing guidelines for honors and awards.

As such, the OLSNOE recognizes and honor alumni who have achieved distinction and unusual positive recognition in their chosen fields, professions, or public service, and who have demonstrated outstanding achievement thereby serving as role models on a community, provincial, national, or international level.

Awardees may also be recognized if they have brought honor and glory to their Alma Mater, community, or country. If a graduate has rendered dedicated and exemplary volunteer service or support to either the DLSAA or their Alma Mater (or both), they can also be considered for an award.

Other possible factors for consideration include: performing beyond normal expectations in DLSAA's chapters, or attaining notable ratings in government licensure examinations. Furthermore, an individual who is not an alumnus as defined by the Honors and Awards System can still qualify if he or she shows loyalty and rendered volunteer and unsolicited support to the DLSAA or any DLSB - PD school's projects or concerns.

Thus, the OLSNOE seeks to recognize these outstanding people and celebrate their achievements. The work they have done serves as a testament and inspiration to both the Lasallian community and our nation.

#### HISTORY OF THE FLSAAP

Each year, the Catholic Church celebrates the Feast of Pentecost 49 days after Easter. We recall the story of the Apostles who were all weak and cowering in fear of the Jews after the death of Jesus Christ. The room they were in started shaking and a strong wind circled around them. "Tongues of fire" appeared on their head and they were filled with the Holy Spirit. Suddenly, they could speak in different tongues and the fear in them disappeared, strongly proclaiming the glory of God.

It was an empowering act – one that brought out the inner strength of the Apostles. And it was an act of unity. The world became a smaller place then as the Apostles started spreading the Good News to the world.

The Lasallian community in the Philippines emanates from our network of 15 La Salle Institutions. We produce graduates for different professional fields who share the values of Faith, zeal for Service and Communion in Mission (FSC). And yet, we are also distinctly different and unique. Each school has a different persona and culture, brought about by the uniqueness of their location and communities. This is also reflected in the alumni community of these institutions.

The Lasallian alumni communities have demonstrated many times that it is a potent force for good works and service. Time and time again, the different Lasallian Alumni Associations have led the way in responding to the mission of education and to help our communities and country during emergencies and disasters. But when the different Lasallian AA's come together as one, we see the dramatic multiplier effect – we become more than the sum of each part.

By the same token, the different Lasallian schools in the country recognized that there is much to be gained by sharing best practices, harmonizing and synergizing resources and procedures as well as defining common directions and standards. This has led to the creation of the De La Salle – Philippines and the concept of One La Salle.

This became the backdrop for the discussions on federating the different alumni associations. Over the last few years, the De La Salle Alumni Association has been acting as the de facto Federation. The DLSAA Board started including representatives from the other La Salle Alumni Associations and discussions on directions and projects became One La Salle in nature. We cannot, however, take away the fact that the DLSAA is first and foremost, the AA of the De La Salle University. The two missions are equally important and having the responsibility for directing both missions resting on the leadership of the DLSAA is a tremendous challenge.

Recognizing this, the DLSAA authorized the creation of the One La Salle Council of Alumni Presidents (OSLCAP) and dissolved its Board which included representatives from non-DLSU AAs. It re-emerged as the Alumni Association only for the De La Salle University, eventually, becoming the De La Salle University Alumni Association or DLSUAA. The OLSCAP became the precursor for federating all the La Salle AA's. The goal of the OLSCAP is to craft the federation charter and shepherd it towards its creation and act as a coordinating body for all AAs while the federation process was moving forward. OLSCAP was formed cognizant of the fact

that two previous attempts at federating failed because of an attempt to create a legal framework for its existence. As such, it was believed that consultations and consensus building would provide a stronger formula for success.

OLSCAP completed its task in 2014, producing the enabling charter and by-laws that allowed the creation of the Federation of La Salle Alumni Associations of the Philippines (FLSAAP). At the DLSAA World Congress in Clark, Pampanga in May 2015, the first elections of the officers of the FLSAAP were held. Johnny Sy, past President of the DLSAA, was elected as the first Chairman of the FLSAAP and the following were elected officers: De La Salle Lipa Alumni Association, Inc. as Secretary General, De La Salle University Alumni Association as Treasurer and La Salle Green Hills Alumni Association as Chairman of the Lasallian Mission and Formation Committee. Each of the AA's are represented by their duly-elected Presidents or designated liaison officers.


The FLSAAP continues its coordinating mission and interfaces with all the Lasallian AA's around the Philippines. Projects that are One La Salle in nature are "co-branded" with the FLSAAP, providing a unifying agenda so that Lasallians from all its institutions will feel part of a larger and stronger family. The One La Salle Night of Excellence, a project hosted by the De La Salle University Alumni Association, is an example of a co-branded event, as the awardees come from different La Salle schools. In June 2017, the first ever One La Salle Alumni Congress will be hosted by De La Salle Lipa Alumni Association, Inc. and it will showcase our lovely campus in Lipa, Batangas as well as the loving charms of our Batangueño brethrens.

The motto on the De La Salle coat of arms is "Indivisa Manent" – a Latin phrase that means "Permanently Indivisible." This motto appropriately symbolizes how the Federation will be – in short, One La Salle!

As the Apostles were filled with the Holy Spirit and the world became united through the Word of God during and after Pentecost, it is hoped that the Federation and its members will likewise be energized by the Holy Spirit and be united as a community for good. There is much to be done but as we come together as One La Salle, we hope to show the country and the world how Lasallians in the Philippines "Live the Animo!"










## FLSAAP DLSAA **DISTING UISHED** LASALLIAN AWARDES

## JORGE L. ARANETA



AWARDEE




Being a senior artist who serves as a symbol of artistic eminence, Del Mundo has been named the university's artist-in-residence. Thus, he is recognized as DLSU's ambassador of art and goodwill.

However, his achievements also extend into the world of cinema, being a celebrated screenwriter who has brought many brilliant screenplays to life with his talent and wit. Del Mundo's unparalleled writing has been featured in cinematic gems such as 'Merika,

Bayaning 3rd World and Maynila: Sa mga kuko ng liwanag. More than that, he has directed thought-provoking films like Paglipad ng anghel, Maid in Singapore and Tinitingnan, 'Di Nakikita.

## EDGARDO D. GOMEZ, PH.D.


DLSU HS 1957, DLSU AB- BSE 1962, DLSU Doctor of Science honoris causa 2016

Gomez has dedicated himself to improving the state of marine biology in the country, being a founding director of the Marine Science Institute at the University of the Philippines. He was also conferred the Order of National Scientist in 2014.

With his tireless work, Gomez has raised awareness of the importance of preserving the delicate balance of life in our ecosystem. The advancements he made have pushed the envelope of learning about the relationship between marine life and the rest of the planet.

Br. Luistro is passionate about education and its advancement in the Philippines. As a former president of DLSU and Secretary of Education, he has paved the way for the formal instruction of our nation's youth in the years to come.

From 1997-2003, Br. Luistro was Brother Visitor (Brother Provincial) of the De La Salle Brothers in the Philippines. In 2000, he co-founded Universitas Katolik De La Salle (also known as De La Salle Manado) in Indonesia with Josef Suwatan, Roman Catholic Bishop of Manado.

His most notable achievement to date is successfully implementing the K+12 program in the Philippines, thereby institutionalizing universal kindergarten and two more years of secondary school.

This groundbreaking development in the country's educational system is a positive step forward and has impacted the state of learning on a national scale. With this change, many generations of Filipinos can look forward to a brighter future filled with more opportunities than ever.

### CAYETANO W. PADERANGA, JR. PH.D. †

Known as "Dondon" to many, Paderanga was recognized as a technocrat, socioeconomic reform advocate and well-loved professor. Through his work, he espoused the values of public service: intelligence, competence, humility and honesty.


Paderanga was deeply involved in his field, serving many roles that were pivotal to the development of economic study in the country. He was a professor of economics at the University of the Philippines, the Economic Planning Secretary and Director General of the National Economic Development Authority (NEDA).

Aside from that. Paderanga also acted as Undersecretary of the Department of Agriculture, Executive Director the Asian Development Bank, Chief Negotiator of the Philippines for the World

Trade Organization and a member of the Monetary Board of the Central Bank.

One of his other notable achievements was being a founding chair of the Foundation for Economic Freedom (FEF), a public advocacy group dedicated to advancing economic and political liberty, as well as governance, market-oriented reforms and consumer protection.

Paderanga was an authority on many topics in his field, including debt management, labor and employment, trade and finance. Thanks to his far-reaching work over the decades, he helped steer our country's economy in a positive direction.



## ROGELIO "BABES" L. SINGSON

Singson is an admired figure in the public sector, thanks to his dedication to serving the Filipino people with honesty, integrity, transparency and accountability.

His solid commitment to his work has helped him in his many roles, such as CEO of Maynilad Water Services Inc., SVP for Business Development at Citadel Holdings Inc., DPWH secretary, and Chairman and President of Bases Conversion and Development Corporation, as well as BCDA Management Holdings Inc. and North Luzon Railways Corporation.

Singson has also won many awards; this includes the TOFIL 2013 Award for Government/Public Service, UPAA Lifetime Distinguished Achievement Award in 2013, and Most Distinguished Alumnus at the 2011 Alumni Engineers Awards.

Because of his extensive endeavors, Singson has come to be known for his untiring drive for innovation and good governance, thereby setting the bar for public service in our country.



The FLSAAP-DLSAA Sports Hall of Fame Award recognizes members of the Lasallian athletic community who have participated in official competitions, either as an individual or with a team. This also extends to those who have served as part of National organizations involved in local or international sports events. This may include but is not limited to the Asian Games, Southeast Asian games and the Olympics.

Furthermore, this award applies to athletes representing DLSU - M or any DLSB - PD school, as well as coaches, trainers, managers,

project directors, cheerleaders, or officials. Other qualified people include people who have helped significantly advance La Salle in the context of Philippine sports.

Awardees must exemplify traits and characteristics in line with Lasallian values. They should also act as a guiding figure for fellow athletes and those in authority. Nominees must have been out of any La Salle District school for at least twenty (20) years from their graduation or last playing date (whichever occurred first) and may receive the award only once.



#### EMMANUEL "NONGNONG" M. CALANOG

Emmanuel Calanog has helped many youths excel to the best of their abilities over the years. He has served the Head Coach of the Pinto (the 8 years and below baseball team) and helped win two championships at the Philippine Tot Baseball Tournament.

Calanog also served as the LSGH Director for Sports from 2002 to 2007, and was involved in the overall supervision of the sports program of the school's physical education, varsity and sports development. He led LSGH to two NCAA Junior Division General Championships in 2004 and 2005.

From June 2010 to October 2010, he was the UAAP Tournament Director for Basketball Season 73. Currently, Calanog works as the DLSU Director for Office of Sports Development, a position he has held since January 2012. His overall supervision of the sports program in DLSU has led to three UAAP General Championships.

Capacio left behind a legacy of excellence, high standard of sportsmanship and dedication to the development of Philippine Sports.



Concepcion became Head Coach for RP Team during the SEA Games in 2003. He then worked as Head Coach for the DLSU Varsity Swimming from 2002-2012, resulting in 5 UAAP Championships.

Concepcion continues to be an inspiration to his colleagues and swimmers all over the country. His excellent track record proves that hard work and focus can go a long way in the sports community here and abroad.



DLSU GS 1955, DLSU HS 1959 RP AND DLSU SPORTS



In 1991, he was the bronze medalist (individual) during the SEA Games. Yam was also the bronze medalist for Team Events in the


same event in 1991 and 1993. In 1985, he was the Malaysian Junior Open Champion in the Under 16 division.

DLSU AB-BSC 1959, BANKING AND FINANCE





BS Industrial Management Engineering 1976, AGRIBUSINESS INNOVATION



From 2016 to 2019, De Mesa was a Member Executive Committee of the Geneva-based Forum—ASIA for Human


rights and Development. In 2015, he served as Member Convenor in the National Monitoring Mechanism (NMM) and Pampanga Local Monitoring Mechanism (PLMM) for extrajudicial killing, enforced disappearance torture. He also served in the BALAY Rehabilitation Center, the Multisectoral Advisory Group, and the PNP Human Rights Affairs Office (HRAO).

From 2008-2014, De Mesa was involved in efforts to sustain specific cases to break impunity by assisting in the establishment of a national and local CSO-people's intervention and monitoring mechanism (CSO-PIMM). He also engaged

Local Government Units with a Human Rights-Based Approach (HRBA) in Governance and Development through HR Education and Case Monitoring.

De Mesa acted as Chairperson for Philippine Alliance of Human Rights Advocates (PAHRA) from 2005 to 2011. This organization was established in 1987 after the ouster of the Marcos dictatorship.

Due to his work with human rights groups, initiatives, and networks, De Mesa has brought human rights to the forefront of national affairs during his decades-long career.



## WILSON C. LIM






He has written more than 200 scripts for both movies and television, and

## RAYMOND GIRARD R. TAN, PH.D.


